Rewound is Bankrupt's 6th release, and the most melodic and easily accessible of them all. It's a unique blend of poppunk and britpop and there's even some surf rock added to the mix.

The spaghetti western influenced instrumental surf rock intro, *Clint* makes it clear right at the beginning that this release is not what you may have expected from Bankrupt. By the second track, you should be convinced that change was good. The title track, *Rewound*, (a sequel to 18 Now from the 2006 album *Shorter Than Danny DeVito*) is a bouncy, ironic time travel to the beginning of Rocco's punk rock adventures, sung by William, and with a healthy dose of britpop injected into it.

Weekend depicts the dichotomy of monotonous weekdays in the office and coming to life on weekends by its Orwellian verses relentlessly marching towards the ultra-melodic chorus.

By this time, you may want some more speed and guitar overdrive. You get them with the last track, *Happenstance*, which is about not losing your optimism to take chances and try new things, while making clear that the sound may change, but the underlying punk rock attitude won't. That's why Rewound is available as a free download on the band's website.
